



**Logitech Europe S.A. Compliance with Restriction of Hazardous substances
(RoHS) European Directive (2011/65/EC)**

Dear Partner,

Logitech is committed to strict compliance with all applicable laws and regulations globally, including all new requirements adopted under the European Union RoHS Recast Directive 2011/65/EC.

On July 1, 2011, the European Union published a revision of the original RoHS Directive (2002/95/EC), known as RoHS 2 or RoHS Recast. Under the revised Directive (2011/65/EC), RoHS Recast codifies documentation, marking, and manufacturer, importer and distributor responsibilities under the new Directive, including product CE marking and manufacturer Declaration of Conformity with enforcement from January 2nd, 2013.


All Logitech products available for sale on the European market after January 1st, 2013 are compliant under RoHS 2, including continued product compliance to specific hazardous substance restrictions as set forth by the original RoHS Directive (2002/95/EC) and re-enforced under RoHS 2.

Logitech maintains a system capable of demonstrating single component traceability to RoHS compliance via Declaration of Conformity and other technical documents such as X-ray Fluorescence testing (XRF) and Chemical analysis (ICP) test reports at a homogeneous level.


Furthermore, to ensure ongoing product compliance with RoHS 2, Logitech has implemented a RoHS Sustaining Program which incorporates regular manufacturing product and supplier audits; maintenance of component substance analysis reports and the maintenance of a RoHS Management System.
