



## **LOGITECH EUROPE S.A. COMPLIANCE WITH THE WASTE ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT (WEEE) EUROPEAN DIRECTIVE**

Dear Partner

The European Union Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive (2002/96/EC) which sets collection, recycling and recovery targets for Electrical and Electronic goods placed on the EU Market has now been implemented into most national legislations of the EU member states.

According to the European Directive, the national WEEE legislation shall make producers of electrical and electronic equipment responsible for the collection and recycling of such waste equipment and Logitech wishes to share with you how we intend to meet our obligations under this Directive.

Logitech is committed to strict compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, including European and Member State WEEE legislation and therefore, Logitech will comply with the WEEE Directive requirements and, where it is made possible by national legislation, Logitech will register directly with the National WEEE registry and/or National WEEE scheme and will take direct financial and administrative responsibility for WEEE reporting, recovery and recycling of all Logitech and Labtec branded products placed on the relevant national market.

In addition, Logitech is an active member of the European Recycling Platform (ERP) which is a pan-European WEEE compliance scheme setup in 2002 to ensure as cost-effective implementation of the national WEEE schemes administered by ERP. Such a scheme has been established for the benefit of participating companies and their customers and Logitech's membership of ERP is your assurance that Logitech and Labtec product benefits from the most cost effective WEEE scheme within the countries in which ERP currently operates.

Logitech's preference remains, where possible, to continue to operate within the relevant ERP national scheme, but where ERP does not operate in a specific country then Logitech intends to evaluate and become a member of an efficiently operated and recognised National WEEE scheme which will allow us to take direct producer responsibility for the Member State in which that scheme operates.

A Logitech WEEE Team has been established, which includes representatives from all relevant organisational functions, to lead our WEEE efforts. The WEEE Team has undertaken extensive planning, assessment and implementation work since early 2005 and is in the process of finalising WEEE registration as this is becoming possible by National legislations.
