## Proposition 65 ("Prop 65") Declaration

California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 ("Proposition 65") was introduced to ensure California citizens can make informed decisions about products and protect themselves from potential exposure to carcinogens and reproductive toxins.

As part of our established Hazardous Substances Management System ("HSMS"), we monitor Prop 65 developments, including annual additions to the Prop 65 List. We review the list on a regular basis and survey suppliers to obtain assurances and information on substance use.

Where a Prop 65 Listed substance is identified as being potentially used in Logitech products, our internal team carries out substance characterization, to understand the toxicity risks associated with the substances and review any prescribed restrictions under RoHS, REACH, IEC 62472 and Prop 65 (i.e. Safe Harbor Levels: NSRLs, MADLs; and also NOELs, SUDs and Reformulation Thresholds).

We consider the magnitude of exposure (i.e. likely concentration of the substance) and the frequency of exposure (potential for prolonged skin contact). We take advice and guidance from Industry bodies and commission third-party lab verification testing, where appropriate. We add restriction thresholds to our General Specification for the Environment (GSE) Standard, which is enforced as a contractual requirement across all products and manufacturing.

With this approach, we ensure there is no significant risk to human health or customer health, safety or wellbeing and then we apply the precautionary principle and apply the relevant Prop 65 label as a precautionary measure, to ensure customer awareness.
